Norwegian reveals how to escape 'Blue Monday'

Low-cost airline Norwegian has revealed how to escape the dreaded 'Blue Monday', reported to be the most depressing day of the year. Falling on the third Monday in January (16th January 2017) the date has been dubbed 'Blue Monday' due to a number of factors including post-Christmas blues, the gloomy weather, a lack of money, and low motivation levels.

For travellers still looking to enjoy the Christmas spirt, the northern town of Rovanemi offers a chance to meet Santa Claus 365 days of the year, so it really can be Christmas every day! *Norwegian offer a direct flight from London Gatwick to Helsinki from £29 one-way and Rovaniemi from £69.90 one-way.*

Norway

With its abundance of outdoor pursuits and fantastic scenery, as well as the chance to see the Northern Lights, it is no wonder Norway made it to number four in the World's Happiest Countries list. Travellers looking to tick off a new year's resolution can take advantage of the country's gorgeous landscape and hike through Norway's magnificent fjords before heading to the capital Oslo for some cultural experiences. Denmark

Leading the way to the number one spot as the happiest country on Earth is Denmark, according to the World Happiest Report. With the British taking inspiration from the Danish tradition of 'hygge' (loosely meaning 'cosiness') throughout 2016, travellers can head to Copenhagen with Norwegian to experience the Danish way of living for themselves. Norwegian flies direct from London Gatwick and Edinburgh to Copenhagen from £29 one-way or direct to Aalborg from London Gatwick from £29.
