collaboration especially with our Network and Revenue Department. She explains how the cargo organisation works through an ever-expanding network of general sales agents throughout the world. And with the new transatlantic routes from Amsterdam, Madrid and Milan starting up this European summer, there are ample opportunities for attracting new cargo customers.
